An Executive session was held from 6:50-7:24 to discuss issues pertaining to litigation, County Assessment, Personnel and pipeline. The Greene Township Board of Supervisors met for their regular monthly meeting on the above date at the Municipal Building, with Supervisors Michael Messner and Merry Smith present, along with 12 visitors, Solicitor Mike Jones and Administrative Secretary/Treasurer Kimberly Moore. Chairman Brian Herron called the meeting to order at 7:25 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

HONORS AND RECOGNITIONS-None

MINUTES of the March 7, 2017 meeting and March 28th workshop -approved. Motioned by Mike Messner, seconded by Merry Smith. MC

TREASURER'S REPORT for March 7, 2017 /APPROVAL OF BILLS PRESENTED-approved. Motioned by Mike Messner, seconded by Merry Smith. MC.

GRANT UPDATES: SHARON ROAD STREAM CROSSING-No Update MILL CREEK PARK COMFORT STATIONS-The stones have been removed from around the concrete pad so that PA Builders can come back in the next couple of weeks to repair.

OLD BUSINESS – UPPER SERVICE BRIDGE PROJECT- an email was received from Jet Excavating stating that they did not receive an approval from PENNDOT to pave out of season. Therefore, they could not pave in March and paving will not be able to begin until possibly April 10th, weather permitting. After paving they will need approximately four days to backup, install guide rail, seed and mulch. OLD GARAGE REPAIRS – the outside walls need repointed to stop the rain from entering the building. Nick Maravich has offered to do the job at a cost of \$800.00. It would take approximately four days. NEW BUSINESS- REQUEST TO BORROW ROAD SIGNS-A resident has ask if it would be possible to borrow a few road signs for a gymnastics show that Monaca Turners is putting on the week of April 17th. It is themed “Road Trip”. The signs would be returned after the show. Roadmaster Merry Smith said that PENNDOT had given the township several signs a few years ago that were not being used and saw no reason not to let them borrow them.

REPORTS- Roadmaster-Merry Smith spoke to Suit-Kote about McCleary road. PARKS AND RECREATION-a resident found a couple in a car at the park passed out and had to call an ambulance. Brian Herron stated that he still feels that putting a gate up at the main entrance of the park is warranted and would deter people from being in the park after hours. BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS-Nothing. ENGINEER – the board would like the engineer to be contacted to look into the McCleary Road issue and give advice, if possible, about corrections. CODE ENFORCEMENT/ZONING- OFFICER- A March report was given. COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENT a representative from Rothfus' office was in attendance asking what everyone wanted to see worked on in the future. The most popular answers were drug enforcement, and riverfront development and funding.

PLANNING COMMISSION –Chairwoman Rose Kendall said that the Hall and Morgan subdivisions were complete. **5-10 YEAR PLAN**- a DCNR Forester will be coming on April 12th to walk the township’s riverfront property to see what options may be available. **TECHNOLOGY, FACEBOOK, WEBSITE**- Administrative Assistant Glenda Short and Francis Himic are working on updating the Website.

CORRESPONDENCE-NONE. **VISITORS**-Bill McElhaney ask about the Police Per Capita Tax. Ron Miller talked about a phone scam that is going around. Bill Warnock spoke about trying to get Lock 7 designated in the historical registry. **FIRST ENERGY UPDATE**-None **EXECUTIVE SESSION**-held from 8:50-9:07 to discuss personnel issues and possible litigation.

ADDITIONAL BUSINESS-Mike Messner stated that he took stone to Tower Lane and noticed that there were lines hanging 8-10’ off the ground.

As there was no further business to discuss a motion to adjourn was made at 9:00 pm by Mike Messner with a second by Merry Smith. MC.
