Bucket Truck-The bucket truck passed inspection and the road department is waiting on a fitting that is needed to repair a seep in one of the lines.

## **PARKS AND RECREATION –**

Switchback Crossing-Pictures were shown of the repairs that are currently in the works for the switchback tributary crossing along the North Mile Trail. A new Pipe, gravel and foundation stones have been installed.

Covered Bridge-someone vandalized the covered bridge along the North Mile Walking Trail. Several boards were knocked out of the walls and repairs will need to be done.

Trash Receptacle-Trevor Infantozzi built a trash receptacle out of old barn-style wood to match the covered bridge and brought it to the meeting to showcase.
