

PROCLAMATION

OF GREENE TOWNSHIP, HOOKSTOWN, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

WHEREAS, Greene Township recognizes the vital importance of environmental stewardship and the preservation of local wildlife; and

WHEREAS, native wildflowers and plants play a crucial role in sustaining biodiversity, improving soil health, and supporting pollinators such as bees, butterflies, and other beneficial species; and

WHEREAS, Greene Township seeks to collaborate with Shell Pipeline in an effort to implement sustainable land management practices that foster ecological balance and environmental resilience; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the township, its residents, and future generations to actively contribute to the preservation and restoration of native plant species;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Greene Township, Hookstown, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, formally commits to working in coordination with Shell Pipeline for the betterment of the environment and wildlife; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Greene Township shall undertake efforts to plant native wildflowers on township property, encourage the growth of native plant species, and foster an ecosystem that supports local flora and fauna; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Greene Township shall engage with community members, conservation groups, and local experts to promote awareness and education regarding the benefits of native plant restoration and environmental sustainability.
